Dr. David Morwood was playing at the Hyatt Regency Monterey after the Monterey Jazz Festival when a spectator pulled out a horn and joined the band.

The surprise guest was in fact Wynton Marsalis.

"It was like Mickey Mantle coming by and wanting to play catch," says Morwood, who has also jammed with other jazz greats including John Clayton, Branford Marsalis, Ray Drummond and Roy Hargrove. Now Jazz Director and Drummer in Residence at the Hyatt, Morwood once performed at the White House and sang in a national anthem chorus on "Monday Night Football."

By day, Morwood is a Monterey plastic surgeon who recently released an educational breast cancer film hosted by Dina Eastwood. Each year, he also travels to developing countries to operate on needy children. The Jazz Journalists Association honored him for those efforts in 2003.

"I put myself through medical school playing gigs," says Morwood, who rocks the Hyatt's remodeled Fireplace Lounge each weekend.
